November 10 – Matthew 6:19-24 --- My Home

Icebreaker:

What is one hobby you have always wanted to try?

Discussion Questions:

1. Sermon Recap

- a. How would you recap the main points shared in the sermon this weekend?
- b. What stood out to you or resonated with you from the message?

2. Entrusted by God

- a. Ask someone in your group to read 2 Corinthians 8:10-11 and 1 Corinthians 4:1-2.
- b. What does it mean for us to be "entrusted" with the resources God has given us?
- c. What can it look like in your life to use all that God has given you for His purposes and not your own?

3. Tithes and Alms

- a. The sermon explained the two types of giving shown in the Bible, tithes and alms. Why do you think this distinction is made? How does each reflect our heart towards God?
- b. Why do you think Jesus emphasized giving so much throughout His ministry?

4. Where is my treasure?

- a. Ask someone in your group to read **Matthew 6:19-21**.
- b. As you reflect on your life, how would you answer the question "Am I storing up treasures in Heaven or am I more concerned about treasuring things here on earth?"

5. What is my focus?

- a. Ask someone in your group to read **Matthew 6:22-23**.
- b. What have your eyes been fixed on lately? How can focusing on God help you see other ways to use your resources?

6. Who is my Master?

- a. Ask someone in your group to read **Matthew 6:24**.
- b. Who is the master in your home: God, or money? How can you ensure that your household serves God first? How can you make decisions about your finances that reflect this priority?

7. Closing Commitments

- a. Is there an area of your life where you have been seeking the wrong treasure or focusing on the wrong things that you can surrender to God?
- b. How can you use the money and time God has entrusted you with to advance His Kingdom?
- c. What steps can you take to apply some of these stewardship principles in your home?
