



Life Group Discussion Guide

March 31 – 1 Corinthians 15 – The Resurrection

Icebreaker:

What were some of your family traditions at Easter as you were growing up?

Have you adopted any new traditions/practices surrounding Easter/Resurrection Sunday? Share.

Discussion Questions:

1. Ask someone to read aloud **1 Corinthians 15** aloud.
 - What stands out to you from this text?
 - What stood out to you from the sermon on Sunday?
2. How has Christ's resurrection impacted your life?
3. How does Christ's resurrection (and victory over death) give you hope? ... in your suffering? ... in your mourning? ...in your daily life? (for today and for tomorrow?)
4. Read **Acts 2:22-39**. This is a portion of Peter's sermon at Pentecost. How does this text undergird what Paul is stating in 1 Corinthians 15? How did those listening to Peter's preaching that day respond? How do you respond?
5. Theologian Warren Wiersbe considers **1 Corinthians 15:58** to be "Paul's hymn of praise to the Lord." Wiersbe states that "in it we can know that nothing we do for Him will ever be wasted or lost." How does this perspective help as you consider your work for the Lord? How does the truth of Christ's resurrection encourage you to give yourself fully in your own service and witness for the gospel?
6. Randy said, "what goes into the grave is not what comes out." How does the promise of a resurrection body (**1 Cor 15:35-57**) encourage you in your faith (or does it)?

7. How can you live differently in light of **1 Corinthians 15**, not just as we celebrate Resurrection Sunday but over the course of a lifetime? How can you share the gospel message of Christ's resurrection with others, especially those who may not believe it at first?
8. **1 Corinthians 15:57** states, "Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" Take time as a group to offer a prayer of thanksgiving to God the victory He gives us through Jesus Christ. Confess any ways you may forget the victory you've been given. Ask for His help to walk in the resurrection power of Jesus, by the help of His Holy Spirit.
