- 1. Ask someone to read aloud 1 Corinthians 11:17-32.
  - What stands out to you from this text?
  - What stood out to you from the sermon on Sunday?
- 2. When we take communion, we are remembering "my story of how Jesus redeemed my life." How would you explain this story in your own words? (This may be a good time to practice one-minute testimonies: I was... But God... Now...)
- 3. What do we miss out on when we try to make communion a private moment? What can we do to make communion about more about the family of God rather than ourselves as individuals?
- 4. Randy noted that when we take communion, we examine our lives so that we may repent and pursue holiness. What are some things that you or someone else would need to do in order to take communion so that it reflects both of these things?
  - Would you be willing to share one way you will repent or pursue holiness this week?
- 5. When we take communion, we know that life won't always be hard in a given circumstance. We know that we are looking forward to a table in Heaven. What would be different about your life if you always lived focused on this hope?

## 6. Closing Commitments

- Examine yourself in light of the love and death of Christ. Is there and callousness or hypocrisy in your life that does not reflect the love and death of Christ?
- Examine yourself in light of the body of Christ's believers. Do you think Christ is pleased by the way you treat those around you?
- As you examine your own life, is there anything you have been covering up that you need to repent of before God or to someone else? Can you commit to doing that this week?
- Your story is that you are redeemed in Jesus and have hope in Him. Who will you invite to Easter Services so they can experience the message of the hope we have in Jesus?
