April 21 – 1 Corinthians 10 – All for His Glory

Icebreaker:

What is one hobby you have always wanted to try?

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Depending on your perspective, the idea that "history repeats itself" can either be a bit discouraging or comforting. How do you tend to feel about this truth? Why is that?
- 2. Look over **1 Corinthians 10** and/or your notes from the message.
 - What verse or concept stood out to you in this text? Why was that especially meaningful for you?
 - What was something you learned?
- 3. The Israelites are often <u>the</u> example of unfaithfulness in Scripture. Here Paul references the Exodus story and their time spent in the wilderness. As a group, briefly retell the Exodus story to perhaps gain further insight into Paul's teaching. (For the group leader, the Bible Project has short videos on Exodus and Numbers if you need a quick recap for yourself.)
- 4. Paul's point in **1 Corinthians 10:12-13** is that pride will blind us to the same temptations that the Israelites (and all humans) faced. We all struggle with the same stuff. But what promise does Paul state in verse 13?
- 5. There is no circumstance that will force us to live outside the character of Christ. Righteousness is always an option. Emotionally and practically, how do you respond to this promise? Does this change how you view temptations and hard circumstances?

- 6. What point is Paul making in **1 Corinthians 10:23-24**? How do these verses help us determine how we interact with both believers and non-believers? What are the risks of doing what Paul says here? What are the rewards?
- 7. Jerry Bridges, in his book "Pursuit of Holiness" talks about how our immaturity will ask "how close we can get to the world without 'sinning'?" while maturity will ask "How godly can I be" or "how close to Christ can I get?" How would a person grow if the mature question was all they asked? How might the church be impacted by someone's commitment to this mindset?
