May 26 – 1 Corinthians 16 – Kingdom Plans

Icebreaker:

What is the best piece of advice you have ever received?

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Ask someone to read aloud 1 Corinthians 16:1-4.
 - a) What stands out to you from this text?
 - b) What stood out to you from the sermon on Sunday?
- 2. Paul emphasized the importance of the Corinthian church's involvement in supporting the church in Jerusalem during a time of need. Have you witnessed or experienced occasions where a church community contributed to the well-being of others? What were the repercussions of this generosity?
- 3. In this passage, Paul highlighted three Kingdom instructions about the offering: the church should give regularly; everyone has the responsibility to give; and everyone should give in proportion to their income. In your opinion, which of these is most challenging for believers to put into practice?
- 4. Have someone in your group read **Mark 12:41-44**. What thoughts and feelings surface in response to this passage? How does it impact your view on giving?
- 5. The sermon highlighted the correlation between financial generosity and worship. Do you feel like you are worshipping God when you give financially? What can you do to enter into the mindset of worshipping when you give?
- 6. In the message, Randy encouraged us to make Kingdom plans, but hold them loosely and be mindful of open doors that may present themselves. Do you have any Kingdom plans you'd like to share with the group? Has God opened doors to new Kingdom plans that have altered plans you had in place? Did you experience any opposition to these plans?

7. Do you struggle to hold your plans loosely? How can you balance making plans and submitting to God's will?

8. Closing Commitments

- a) Is God calling you to be more generous in your life? Do you need to start giving? Give more regularly? Or increase your giving? How can you bless others with what God has blessed you with?
- b) Read **1 Corinthians 16:13-14**. Which one of these five closing statements stands out to you the most? Which do you most need to be reminded of as you go throughout your week? How will you remind yourself?
