



## Life Group Discussion Guide

### November 12 – A Heart Agreement - Nehemiah 10

#### Icebreakers:

If you could describe your personality as a flavor, what would it be and why?

What's the best BBQ in KC and why?

#### Discussion Questions:

1. Nehemiah 10 records the people of Jerusalem making a covenant with God. What does making a covenant with God mean to you, and how does it impact your life?
2. In this chapter, the people committed to following God's law and honoring His name. How can we ensure that we are living in accordance with God's commandments in our own lives today?
3. The people pledged not to intermarry with foreign nations (verse 30). What lessons can we draw from this in terms of maintaining our spiritual identity and values in a diverse and changing world?
4. The commitment to the Sabbath is highlighted in verse 31. How do you prioritize rest and spiritual reflection in your busy life, and what benefits have you experienced from this practice?
5. Verse 32 mentions their commitment to providing for the needs of the temple. How can we, as a group, support and care for the spiritual needs of our faith community?
6. The people also committed to giving their firstfruits and tithes (verse 35-37). How can we apply the principle of generous giving in our own lives and to support the work of God's kingdom?
7. Nehemiah 10 emphasizes the importance of financial accountability in the use of temple resources (verses 38-39). How can we ensure financial accountability and stewardship within our faith community?

8. Verse 39 speaks of the commitment to the "house of our God." What does it mean to you to be committed to the "house of our God" in the context of the modern church and your faith community?
9. The people vowed not to neglect the house of God (verse 39). In what ways can we actively participate in and contribute to the spiritual growth and vitality of our faith community?
10. Reflect on your personal commitments to God and the church. How can we encourage and support one another in our individual and collective commitments to God's work and His people?
