



# Life Group Discussion Guide

## January 18: Daniel 2 --- The Timeless King & Temporary Thrones

### Icebreaker:

Would you rather sit next to someone on a plane who takes their socks off during the flight or be actual friends with someone who showers with their socks on?

### Discussion Questions:

*Every group is different! As you prepare, choose the questions that best fit your group, focusing on those that spark meaningful conversation. Don't rush—depth is better than distance. Trust the Holy Spirit to lead your discussion!*

**Big idea:** History is His story. Even When He feels absent, his power is present.

**Read Daniel 2:1-6, 10-11, 17-18 (or 1-18 if time permits)**

- When King Nebuchadnezzar was furious, Daniel told his companions to seek mercy from God (verse 18). In difficult situations where do you turn first to obtain mercy? To God or to people?
- The first sermon point emphasized that God rules those who rule. How did God demonstrate his rule to Nebuchadnezzar? Can you think of other times in the Old Testament where God demonstrated his rulership over rulers?

**Read Romans 8:28; Job 33:14**

- The sermon highlighted how God spoke to Nebuchadnezzar, even though Nebuchadnezzar did not seek to hear from God. God seeks those who aren't seeking him.
- What is your default source for wisdom?
- How might God be seeking you? How can you hear his voice and know it's him?

**Read Daniel 2:19-24**

- Think about the rulers and events going on in our world right now. How does your perspective change when you view those things in light of God being the ruler over all those who rule?

### **Read Daniel 2:25 (Proverbs 22:11)**

- God is shaping history and he is shaping your story. In the sermon we were challenged to follow Daniel's example of humility and expectation. How can you live in humility and expectation of God this week?

### **Read Daniel 2:31-46; Galatians 4:4**

- How does this story point to Jesus?
- What does the dream and its interpretation tell us about the main story and the main character in the story?
- Why happens when we forgot God's place as the main character of our story?

### **Reflection and Application:**

The takeaway asked: *"Is God the main character in your story?"*

- What are some subtle ways we can keep ourselves as the main character instead?
- What is one concrete step you could take this week to re-center your story around God's purposes?
